Luke: Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them (Luke 24:10)
John: Mary Magdalene and others (John 20:1-2)

Who was Mary Magdalene?

Some people say that she...
She had been healed of seven demons. (Luke 8:2)
She traveled with Jesus and the disciples. (Luke 8:2)
She was at the Cross and the tomb. (Matt. 27:56, 61)

What happened to her on Easter morning?

She went to help with the burial rites. (Matt. 28:1)
She was one of the first to see the empty tomb. (Matt. 28:6)
She was the first to see the risen Jesus. (John 20:16)

She was called to be a witness.

About her personal experience of healing.
