The first major Pentecost was in the desert at Mt. Sinai. (Ex. 19)

Pentecost was a regular festival for the people of Israel. (Lev. 23:15)

The second major Pentecost was in the city on Mt. Zion. (Acts 2:1-13)

What did the Spirit do at Pentecost?

He baptized them into the new Church. (1 Cor. 12:13)

He filled them. (2:4)

He allowed them to speak in other languages. (2:4)

He spoke through the believers to people of other lands.
(2:11)

He gave clear evidence of a new age. (2:13-17; Joel 2:28)

He offered relationship to the whole world. (1:8; 2:9-11)

He offered relationship through Jesus and not the Law.
(2:37-39)
